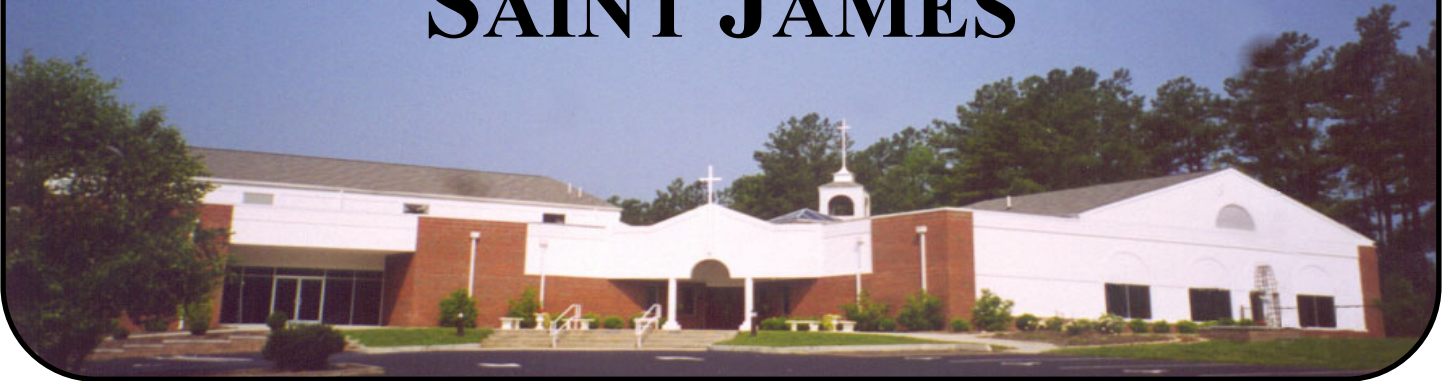

The historic Dedication of Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral is July 26th! It's hard to believe that we have come so far in building a new mother church for the Diocese of Raleigh; a place where people for hundreds of years will gather to give praise to God.
