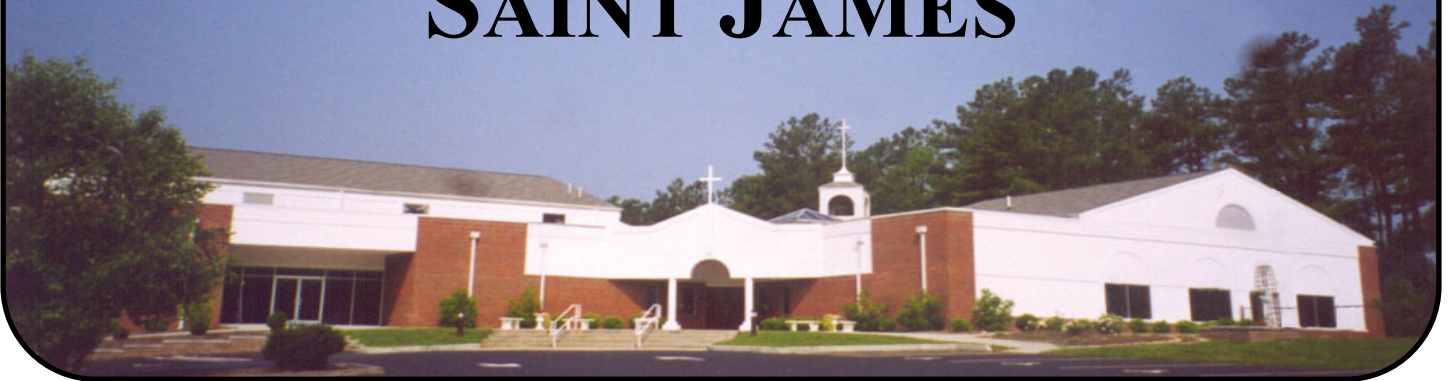

RCIA

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a parish program for those interested in joining the Roman Catholic Church. It is a nine month program aimed at formal entrance during the Easter Vigil Mass.

The RCIA is specifically designed to be used for Non-Catholics but also those Catholics wishing to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist. The format is a study/discussion group led by our pastor Father John.

Adult Faith Formation Classes

Starting on Thursday **September 28th**, and continuing on October 5th and 12th at 10:00 am in the library, we will begin a three part series on the Book of Exodus. With the help of DVD's we will see and listen to college professors and learn about this important second book of the bible on two different levels:

1. as an account of an actual historical people called out of a land of slavery into the Promised Land
2. as a description of our own exodus out of some present day unhappiness or disorder or addiction that we experience.

We will see that the biblical journey into the Promised Land is also our journey. Through our own private reflections and personal meditations, we can meet the characters in our personal history such as Pharaoh the tyrant, or Moses the leader, and we will pass through the Red Seas and deserts and mountains in our own life. Hopefully we will see the Exodus as our own salvation story, allowing God to test us, purify us, and lead us to divine intimacy. Please join us.

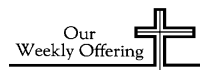
ACTS
